PARENTS

In our efforts to insure your child has everything they need for a safe fun week at camp, we have a few procedures to highlight for our first aid procedures:

FIRST AID LOCATION: We have set up our clinic in Rattler's Retreat. This is the central location for all of our camper first aid needs.

REGISTERED NURSE ON STAFF: There will be a registered nurse on staff and she will be available to meet and visit with you each Monday in order to collect all medications and learn about your child's first aid care. You will enter through the Smith Barry entrance after you have dropped off your camper at the main entrance. The nurse will be there to meet you and discuss your child's medical needs for the week in this drive-thru process. (We do not accept medications sent in your child's backpack or handed to the staff during drop off.)

FORMS: Forms for special medical needs can be found on your Parent Dashboard.

MEDICATIONS, ET. ALL: All medications, OTC or prescription, must be in the original container and clearly labeled with your child's name. All EpiPens must have the CT EpiPen Form submitted, and all inhalers must have the Asthma Action Form submitted. Even though you are able to submit the forms online, you still need to visit with the nurse on Monday drop-off to make sure everything is in order. Please check for expiration dates. We are not able to give any medicines, inhalers, or EPI Pens that have expired.

DIABETIC SUPPLIES: All Diabetic supplies must be delivered to the nurse and the Diabetes form must be down-loaded and returned with your physician's signature, either by uploading the form back or bringing it to the nurse on Monday morning.
